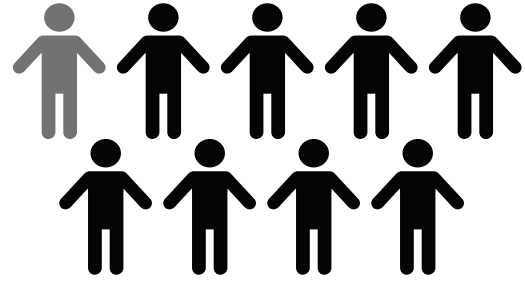


HUNGER & FOOD SECURITY

795 million people globally face hunger.
That's one in nine.

In 2014, more than one in seven people in the United States faced food insecurity.

In the developing world, 66 million students attend school hungry each day.

Sub-Saharan Africa has the highest prevalence of hunger (one in four).

Poor nutrition causes nearly half of deaths in children under five globally.

Two thirds of the world's hungry people live in Asia.

The population of hungry people worldwide could fill New York City nearly 95 times.
